

Accommodation

Whether you are looking to live in a student dormitory or shared apartment, in the city or in the suburbs - we advise you to be flexible. This page provides useful advice for searching for a place to live in Cologne, Gummersbach and Leverkusen.



How to Apply for Student Housing as an Exchange Student at the "Kölner Studierendenwerk" (KStW) for Your Stay at THK

General information about the housing options offered by KStW:

In addition to dormitories with a common kitchen and bathroom we rent out shared flats. We also offer apartments, family apartments for students with children, and barrier-free living space, all available upon request. About half of our rooms and apartments come furnished - the others are unfurnished. Kitchens, laundry and drying rooms are standard facilities. Even internet access is standard. Many residence halls offer a bicycle storage room and some buildings even include fitness and music rooms.

You can submit your application before your course of study begins: <u>Student Housing Application</u>
<u>Form</u>. You can select the desired type of housing and whether or not it needs to be furnished.

Energy saving tips: Rent prices are stated as "warm rent" (Warmendmiete), which includes energy costs. Please nonetheless be mindful when consuming water, electricity and heat. We have put together a few tips on energy saving.


You can search for student housing by applying various filters on this page. This <u>overview</u> will give you an idea of the different types of accommodation available at the different locations and their prices.

Good to know: A shared flat is "Wohngemeinschaft" in German, or WG for short.

When searching, you should look for furnished accommodation ("möbliert"):

→ FYI: You will study at THK's "Campus Südstadt" which is located at Ubierring 48 and Claudiusstrasse 1. An area map can be found on THK's website: www.th-koeln.de/en/suedstadt-campus 76520.php

The district is called "Köln-Südstadt" and is close to Cologne's city center and the river Rhine. THK Südstadt Campus can easily be reached from every dormitory location by public transport*, e.g:

- to station "Ubierring" with tram no 15 and 16 or bus line 133 and 142
- to station "Chlodwigplatz" (five minutes walk to Ubierring) with tram no 17 or bus lines 106 and 132.

Timetables and other connections by tram or bus can be found on the website of the "Kölner Verkehrsbetriebe" (KVB for short): www.kvb.koeln/en

The nearest areas to the "Campus Südstadt" are the following "Stadtteile" (= areas):

- Neustadt Süd
- Zollstock
- Deutz
- Agnesviertel
- Altstadt Nord
- Klettenberg
- Lindenthal
- Sülz.

Also easy to reach is the dormitory in "Hürth-Efferen" a town close to Cologne (can be reached with line no. 18 from station "Barbarossaplatz")

(When looking on your own, do NOT choose Gummersbach and Leverkusen, these are TH campuses in towns outside Cologne.)

Before handing in your application, we would like to give you the following informations:

Your application does not guarantee the renting of a room. Among all applications we receive each year only one third can be supplied with accommodation currently. We recommend to look around, in addition, for residential alternatives in the city. Because of the tight living situation in Cologne you can't submit wishes for specific residences.

Available rooms will be preferentially rented to the following cohorts independently from the time the application arrives:

- 1. disabled students
- 2. students with children
- 3. participants of exchange courses and scholarships
- 4. first-year students (new at the location of university/college)
- 5. students, who live outside cologne
- 6. students, who receive student grants or something similar

As long as a room is available for you, you will receive a written offer. You can accept or reject the offer within the given deadline. After the rejection of the third offer you won't receive any further offer.


You can also apply for accommodation before your studies start! You only have to show the certificate of enrolment when you sign the contract. Please only apply once with one email-address. Multiple applications will be ignored. Please send changes or supplements by email to wohnen@kstw.de. Please send move or re-enter applications formless to the administration of "Studentisches Wohnen" (studential living).

After entering your application you will receive a mail every month with a link, which you have to confirm within 5 days, as long as you are interested in getting a room. If you don't confirm the link, your application will be closed.


A few tips:

- Due to the high demand, student residences will be allocated by the KStW which means that applicants cannot chose a special house or area.
- The earlier you apply, the greater your chances of being offered a place. That's why you should apply to the KStW asap!
- However, an application to the KSTW does not guarantee that you will actually receive an
 offer. You should therefore always look for other accommodation at the same time.
- We recommend that you apply to the KSTW in any case. If you find better accommodation later, you can still turn down the room at the KSTW. There are always students who are on the waiting list.
- The earlier you start your lease (e.g. 1st September instead of 1st October) you might receive a preferencial treatment.

How to fill-in the online application



- * "We mean by that a self-contained flat consisting of one room with a kitchenette, bathroom and WC. There are also 1- double room flats in a few of the dormitories. They are usually bigger than single 1-bedroom flats and can be rented by couples or if desired by single students."
- **A single room reaching on a corridor with shared bath, kitchen, and WC. Some "Flurzimmer" are equipped with a sink. Some halls of residence also provide a common room.
- *** = Wohngemeinschaft: Two to seven students share a flat. Every student has one private room and shares kitchen, bath, and WC with the others.

Please note: After having applied for a place at a hall of residence,

- you will receive an email every month with a link, which you have to confirm within 5 days, as long as you are still interesting in getting a room. If you don't confirm the link, your application will be closed
- you will receive an offer as soon as there's a vacancy. You have to confirm that you
 want to rent the apartment offered by the KStW within a given deadline. If you do
 not answer in time the offer will be given to someone else.

Thus, please check your emails regularly. If you haven't received an offer by late August, i.e. 8 weeks before lectures start, please inquire at the Kölner Studierendenwerk.

Please also note that THK has no influence on the application process nor on the allocation. In case of any questions please address directly to the Kölner Studierendenwerk. Please understand that neither THK nor your home university can answer any questions regarding student housing applications. Thank you for your comprehension.
